

FROM THE OUT-GOING TREASURER

This spring we were able to award \$500 scholarships to six seminarians: Kim Suhr, Emily Stelling, Bethany Ringdal, Mikayla Kopp, Bridget Jones, and Rachel Seija.

I am encouraged to report the SWO convention offering totaled \$4,532. One half of this total \$2,266 was sent to the W/ELCA churchwide office and the remaining half was designated to be divided between Benjamin House for the homeless in Rice Lake and ELCA Disaster Fund. The total cost of the convention was \$6,156 including five scholarships. We were able to reduce the cost of the convention by about \$5,000 by holding it at a church. We thank Bethany Lutheran Church for hosting our convention.

This is my last term as your SWO treasurer. It has been an honor serving you as the keeper of your offerings. I have been able to meet so many faithful officers of our church units and witnessed your generosity. Please send your offerings to your new treasurer Phyllis Beastrom after July 1. You are in experienced hands with her, as she has been a previous treasurer.

Convention News

2018 Convention "Be Renewed in the Spirit"

This year the convention was held April 20-21, 2018 at Bethany Lutheran Church in Rice Lake. Those attending included 37 voting members, 85 non-voting members, 11 SWO officers and board members, and 14 speakers, presenters and guests for a total of 147 attendees.

During the Friday night business meeting delegates for the 2020 Triennial were selected. New officers and board members were elected.

The delegates voted to suspend conference-sponsored leadership training days in favor of SWO Board providing training for all leaders in the northern half of our synod and an identical training day for the southern half of the synod with special accommodation made for new financial secretaries. The SWO board is looking into possible locations of Hayward and Osseo on September 22 and 29. After receiving so many positive responses, the SWO board has decided to reserve Bethany Lutheran Church for the SWO Convention to be held April 24-25, 2020.

Come to a hearing on the <u>Draft of the Social Statement on Women and Justice!</u>

The Northwest Synod of Wisconsin is hosting a hearing on the text of the "Draft Social Statement on Women and Justice on Thursday August 16th at 2:30 pm in the dining hall at Luther Park just outside of Chetek. This afternoon represents a time when the Chippewa Valley women are completing their summer retreat and the Dairyland and Lake Superior gals are arriving for theirs. Attendance is not limited to women or retreaters, however. Everyone is welcome for the hearing.

This hearing is a special opportunity to respond to the text of the draft statement and to hear the perspective of others as well. A representative of the ELCA Task Force on "Women and Justice: One in Christ" will be present at the hearing. (This Task Force wrote the document.)

An appointed recorder will keep track of everything said (without names) and submit a report to the task force. Members of the task force will read all reports as they prepare to revise the text this coming fall. A revised statement will be issued in February of 2019 based on the feedback from the hearings being held around the whole USA.

Over 100 listening events were already held, and specialists have provided insight on Scripture, theology, economics, history, media and more. Study documents have been made available to all congregations.
