Morning of Renewal for the St. Croix Valley Conference takes place on Saturday, April 5 at Mt. Zion Lutheran Church in Hudson. They have chosen a Western theme for this event and encourage attendees to wear Western attire. Mt. Zion is also partnering with Turning Point (for victims of domestic and sexual violence) in River Falls. They will be accepting in-kind donations of shampoo/conditioner, body wash/lotion and combs and/or brushes.

The guest speaker is Nikki Ness, founder of "Eyes That See," a non-profit organization located in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. The non-profit is committed to fighting poverty and injustice through

community, education, and empowerment, specifically by helping women leave the sex industry. They provide safe housing, medical care, counseling, and vocational training as well as a strong sense of community. The organization will host a craft sale during lunch, the proceeds of which will go to "Eyes That See." (eyesthatsee.org)

In this issue of The Northwester, we highlight the women's activities at Redeemer Lutheran Church in Burkhardt.

The women at Redeemer Lutheran Church in Burkhardt remain very active! We have a very committed group of quilters who "turn-out" quilts at an amazing rate! Quilts are donated to a large variety of non-profit groups. In November of 2024 our Women's Thank Offering Service included a guest speaker, Pati Kachel from "The Parable Fund." She presented "A Patchwork Quilt of Heartwarming Stories" with beautiful quilts and inspiring stories.

A Chili Supper fundraiser is held every October (since 1954!). We also deliver Christmas gifts to homebound members. Through 5th Sunday Women's offerings, we can support several local and worldwide needs as well as support our church women. We continue to evolve, but constants are Bible Studies, altar guild, Sunday coffee fellowship and assisting at Redeemer in any way necessary to share God's light and love to all.

2025 is Year C in our lectionary and our gospel readings are from the book of Luke. Luke 4:16-19 finds Jesus in his hometown of Nazareth where he makes the public announcement of his vocation. He quotes the Hebrew Bible (Isaiah):

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind to let the oppressed go free to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor.

What an outline! This is what our women's groups are doing; not necessarily uniform, but still united.

# **Heart of the North Conference** Janice Ahneman

For the Heart of the North Conference Day of Renewal held at Bethany Lutheran Church in Rice Lake in October of 2024, the board members were looking for a way for attendees to interact with each other. They came up with an idea for each woman to share with their table mates what activities and ministries her church is involved with during the year. Then one person from each church shared with the whole group what goes on in her church.

The list is 44 items long! Lutheran World Relief was the recipient of many church projects: quilts by the hundreds, kits galore, fabric kits, health kits, school kits and money.

Food is another big area of ministry. Community dinners, Harvest suppers, Halloween, hot dogs, and water, lefse making, bake sales, food pantry support and Ruby's Pantry.

Clothing projects were numerous as well. School closets, shoe drives for local organizations and overseas, stockings and socks, winter clothing, i.e., hats, scarves and mittens and gloves. Also sponsoring wash days at laundromats at reduced rates for lowincome families.

Our Bibles camps also benefitted from women groups activities as well as the ELCA via Good Gifts, Benjamin House, nursing homes, Pregnancy Help Center, Northwest Passage, Hurricane Relief, Jamaican mission.

Ladies love to sing in Community choirs, help at nursing homes, give parents a night by watching children, make prayer shawls, participate in greeting card ministries, hold Bible studies, help local school children through backpack programs, bazaars, carnivals, and garage sales.

Heart of the North ladies are very busy! Well done, ladies. Well done.

It was a day of New Beginnings at the 2024 Heart of the North Conference Day of Renewal held on October 27 at Bethany Lutheran Church in Rice Lake.

HON Board President Amy Brekke welcomed everyone and introduced HON Synod Representative, Janice Ahneman, and Synod Women's Organization President Joan Moe who gave greetings and updated attendees about activities at synod churchwide. Major events of the past year were the Retreat at Luther Park, Chetek, in June, and the Synod Convention at Spirit Lutheran Church in Eau Claire in September. Elections took place at the convention for representatives to the next WELCA

triennial gathering will be held in Des Moines, Iowa in 2026.

Pastor Susan Odegard presented an inspiring devotion based on her own "New Beginnings" as a second career pastor. We were lead in Sharing the Peace, hymn, prayer, and communion.

The guest speaker was Duana Bremer, Salvation Army Director for Barron, Polk, Burnette, and St. Croix counties. Her inspiring presentation taught us much about the Salvation Army, its history, its missions and programs and its current activities in our area to aide homeless people and those with addiction and mental health issues.

During the business portion of the morning, roll call of the churches was taken (59 people were in attendance), offering collected, installation of officers was conducted.

On a light note, we enjoyed a skit based on a modern version of the story of Mary and Martha from Luke 10: vs 18-42, which pointed out to us how busyness can interfere with our sitting at the feet of Jesus.

During a time of sharing, a person from each congregation present told of the ministries going on in their congregations.

The offering amount was \$592.00. The SWO will get half and H.O.N and Salvation Army Family House Shelter will share half. An In-Kind Offering was also collected of items to be donated at the Salvation Army.

After a wonderful lunch, everyone came away with a new appreciation and gratitude for the work of the Salvation Army as well as the contribution we, as Women of the Heart of the North, do for our communities.



The theme this year comes from Matthew 25:40, 'I'm telling the solemn truth: Whenever you did one of these things to someone overlooked or ignored, that was me—you did it to me.'

Our speaker this year is Paul Savides. Paul is a long-time resident of the Chippewa Valley. He received his BA at Carroll College and MAT at UW Eau Claire. He taught middle school and high school English at Mondovi Schools for 27 years. He has worked as a community organizer in Eau Claire for the past 17 years, primarily as a volunteer organizer with JONAH (Joining Our Neighbors, Advancing Hope). He's a co-chair of the JONAH Affordable Housing Task Force and co-founder and co-director of the Eau Claire Tenant-Landlord Resource Center. He also serves on Dairyland Housing Coalition and the Eau Claire Community Haven House Advisory Committee, which administers a day shelter for people who are experiencing homelessness.

All Women of the ELCA are encouraged to attend and bring a friend!! Elections for coordinator, co-coordinator, and secretary will be held so please designate a delegate from your church unit.
